Raymond Huel is Professor of History at the University of Lethbridge and Director and General Editor of Western Canadian Publishers, the corporate entity that administers the Western Oblate History Project. He is the author of *Proclaiming the Gospel to the Indians and the Métis: The Missionary Oblates of Mary Immaculate in Western Canada, 1845-1945*, and is currently preparing a biography of Bishop Taché of St. Boniface.

Jan Noel teaches Pre-Confederation and Gender history at the University of Toronto at Mississauga. Her book *Canada Dry, Temperance Crusades before Confederation* won the Canadian Historical Association's John A. Macdonald Prize in 1996.
